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Hobson County Park in Ventura is an ocean-shaped campground with campsites all over the edge. Some areas are near the ocean. The park offers beautiful views of the Pacific Ocean and the Norman Islands. You can also see dolphins, surfers, paddle board, and fishing boats. There is a small sandy beach in Hobson which mostly disappears during high tide. While you're there, you can go fishing or wading - or check out the tide pools nearby. People give this camping and park mediocre reviews on average, but most of them are either very high or very low. You can read reviews about Hobson Park in Yelp to get an idea of what the pros and cons are. Hobson has 31 sites for SUVs and tents. Ten of them have connections (50/30/20 amp/100' electricity, water, sewerage and cable TV), but the sites closest to the water are dry. The surface is gravel and there are only a few trees. RVs up to 34 feet long are allowed, but some people who stayed there are told not to bring the installation more than 25 feet long because the parking lot is too tight and crowded. In fact, the small size of the park is the most common complaint from online reviewers. The camp is located between the ocean and the railway tracks. The railway is still in use and you can expect several trains to pass every day. There is also the main highway (US Hwy 101) nearby and you can hear some freeway noise. All campsites in Hobson are offered in the first come, the first to serve based only. They only accept bookings for off-season camping. Each campground has an aluminum picnic table and a ring of fire. The hotel has toilets with flushing toilets and showers with coins. The park has Wi-Fi. There's also a concession booth that sells several food and firewood. Pets are allowed (with a small fee per pet) and they must remain on a leash that is 6 feet long or shorter. Up to 6 people can be in each camping and 3 items (tent, RV or car) are allowed at the campsite. The maximum stay is 14 consecutive days. If you can find a place there, you may prefer Rincon Parkway camping instead. It's not too far away (just a few miles to the north) and has a lot more space (but no showers or toilets). On the other side of these rocks is the Pacific Ocean. You couldn't camp much closer to the beach than this, but it's not quite as close to perfection as it sounds. You can swim at Emma Wood and people sometimes go surfing here. If you bring a fishing rod (and your fishing license), you can catch a few perch, bass, cabezone, or Corbin fish. On the high side, the views are beautiful. Offshore (on a super clear day), you can see the Channel Islands. A squadron of pelicans can fly past in a formation that makes them look like B-52 bombers. People sometimes report sighting dolphins or even random migrating whales from their campsites. All this sounds quite sweet, but there are drawbacks. The location is picturesque but the campsite is wedged between the ocean and the railway track. Expect a few trains to pass every day (and at night, too). And the trains are never quiet. The camp is also just below the elevated highway on the ramp. All this sometimes adds to being annoyingly noisy. Some online reviewers say it feels a little insecure, with the sketch going on. Many holidaymakers report thefts of their equipment or belongings taken from other people's campsites. If you think of Emma Wood not as a park, but rather as a no-frills parking spot for a van, you're less likely to be disappointed.
